Coaches Code of Conduct

- 1. I will remember the 3 top priorities in youth sports: a) Safety, b) skills development, c) fun.
- 2. I will be a role model for the children and will not let my desire to win interfere with the 3 priorities.
- 3. I will learn and play by the rules of the game and will not argue with the official's decisions.
- 4. I will handle disputes with others in private, away from the field and away from other children.
- 5. I will praise both teams for their efforts.
- 6. I will only provide feedback to my players in a positive and constructive fashion.
- 7. I will recognize that children learn differently and adapt my practices to the needs of each.
- 8. I will provide each player with the best possible instruction; I will be a student of the game.
- 9. I will communicate clearly to parents my team goals and parents roles and expected behaviors.
- 10. I will tell my coaches, players and their parents to refrain from booing/taunting/yelling negative comments.
- 11. I will be responsible for the sportsmanship of my players and discourage any behaviors or practices that would endanger the health and well being of other athletes.
- 12. I will remind spectators rooting for my team of the proper conduct required during practices and games.
- 13. I will demand a team environment that is free from profanity, drugs, alcohol and tobacco.
- 14. I will encourage players/parents/coaches to report any unsafe behaviors/incidences to the league.
- 15. I will only file or encourage the filing of ethics complaints that are aimed at protecting the public; the filed complaints will not be done for some trivial, vengeful or spiteful reason.
- 16. I recognize that failure to report any ethical issue is itself an ethics violation.
