STORMWATER MANAGEMENT IN LIBERTY TOWNSHIP

Stormwater is from rainfall or snowmelt that washes pollutants into our storm drains and directly into our rivers, streams and lakes. We ask residents to reduce runoff from your property and reduce pollution in runoff. Some examples include limit the watering of lawns, clean up after pets, and limit use of fertilizers.

Liberty Township has three non-point source pollution control ordinances to help protect our water. These ordinances help to protect our surface and drinking waters.

- Prohibit the feeding of waterfowl (No. 02-07)
- Limit the application of phosphorus fertilizer near water (No. 02-06)
- Regulate the disposal of pet waste (No. 02-08)
