
TAX INFORMATION Property taxes are due to the Tax Collector on the first of August, November, February and May. There is a 10-day grace period. New tax bills to be mailed out by August.



Check our website for making online tax payments.

Farmland Assessment applications are due to the Tax Assessor by August 1.

DOG LICENSING All dogs (6 months or older) are to be licensed during the month of January each year. Fees are \$8 for neutered/spayed and \$11 for non-neutered/non-spayed. A \$5 late fee per month, per animal will be charged after January 31.

STORMWATER MANAGEMENT IN LIBERTY TOWNSHIP

Stormwater is from rainfall or snowmelt that washes pollutants into our storm drains and directly into our rivers, streams and lakes.

We ask residents to reduce runoff from your property and reduce pollution in runoff. Some examples are limit the watering of lawns, clean up after pets, and limit use of fertilizers.

Liberty Township has three non-point source pollution control ordinances to help protect our water:

- Prohibit the feeding of waterfowl (No. 02-07)
- Limit the application of phosphorus fertilizer near water (No. 02-06)
- Regulate the disposal of pet waste (No. 02-08)

Liberty Township is proud of our natural beauty and healthy environment. Every person who lives here has a hand in keeping it clean. How we use our land and what we put in our drains eventually runs off or seeps into our water. The above ordinances help to protect our surface and drinking waters.
